THE EMPEROR'S PATASURREALIST PERMUTATIONS

The writing of a *Patasurrealist Manifesto of His Majesty the Emperor of the Holy Faustrollian Empire*, is related to an activity which, as part of the La Vertèbre et le Rossignol experimental creation workshops, was first manifested under the form of the "hybrid definitions game":

"One must choose two words from the dictionary, then mix parts of their definition. Depending on the chosen words and the state of mind of the players, the new definition will be an accumulation of dreamlike images or a piece of philosophical or political flippancy. In any case, this definition will give rise to analogies that will ruin the tightness of the categories and concepts that obstruct the brains of the academicians, authors of dictionaries." (excerpt from the text presenting the Hybrid Definitions Game, published in the CD of the Festival organized in 2007 by the Surrealist London Action Group)

The process then spread to "hybrid proverbs' from Alex Fatta and I, published in the seventh issue of the social criticism and satire magazine La Conspiration Dépressionniste. Then, in my poetic production, it has been generalized to any form of textual hybridization. The technique used for writing an Imperial Manifesto is another variation of the game of hybrid definitions. The text is composed from sentences extracted from the treatise On magic, by the neopythagorean philosopher Giordano Bruno, as well as an old manual of psychiatry and books by various specialists in symbolism and esotericism: Carl Gustav Jung (Dialectic of me and the unconscious), René Guénon (Perspectives on initiation), Fulcanelli (The Mystery of Cathedrals), René Alleau (La science des symboles), Mircea Eliade

(Aspects of myth), Antoine Faivre (L'ésotérisme) and Luc Benoist (L'ésotérisme). Some words or parts of these sentences are replaced by excerpts from "Notes on Symbolic Thought", which the author held for sixteen years before writing the text. All possible permutations must be tried, which is quite long, but only the most beautiful and surprising sentences are preserved. The texts are structured so that the sentences, in which the same formulas are repeated, are placed in different paragraphs.

The work of poetic archeology, from which the Imperial Manifesto derives, joins the sense of vertiginous erudition as such, that, in pataphysical activity, it is sometimes refined to the point of pseudo-scientific delirium. The occult history of humanity is taken as the *materia* prima of a convoluted hermetic affabulation. Generally speaking, the Emperor symbol embodies the ambiguity of Power, from the desire for justice to destructive selfishness. It also raises the question of the more or less antagonistic relations between spiritual authority and temporal power, reminiscent of the war opposing the Guelphs (belonging to the "solar current", according to the archaeologist Grasset d'Orcet in *Matériaux Cryptographiques*) to the Ghibellines. (lunar current), in Italy and Germany of the XIV century. The Lusitanian myth of the Fifth Empire is part of this symbolic constellation. Moreover, the Portuguese national mythology has an incomparable influence in current Surrealism and the Incoherism of Rémi Boyer, Knight Palotin of the Back of the World within our Protectorat de 'Pataphysique Québecquoise. This is due almost exclusively to the influence of Fernando Pessoa's esoteric poetry; in this regard, see some of the works by my comrades from the surrealist group Collective Automatic Painting Amsterdam. The Empire is a symbol of the inner world, or more precisely, of all that the poet's gaze seizes to transfigure into his mind.
